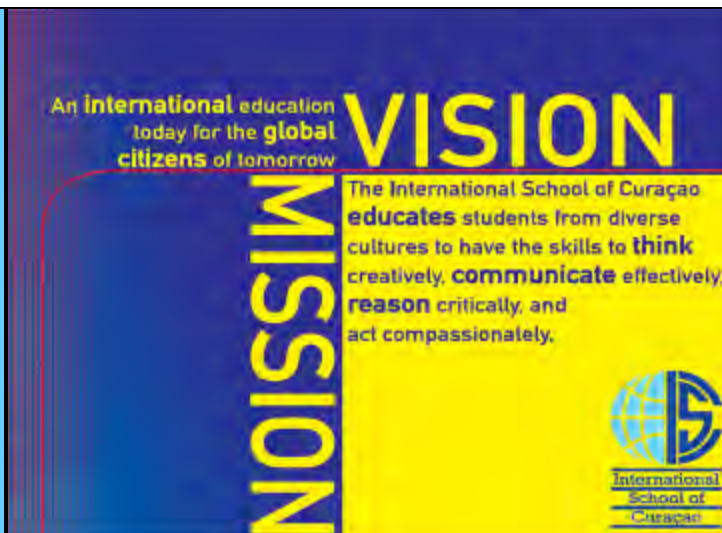

High School News: The Mystery Box Cooking Challenge (March 23rd)

A group of high school students were divided in 3 groups and each group got a box of ingredients with instructions. They had to use all the ingredients in the box to make a dish. The students were spontaneous, quick and creative to find a solution for a dish on the spot as a team. The assignment was timed and the students had one hour to complete a dish and clean up their stations. When all the dishes were ready, we all ate together and cleaned up together.

The objective of the mystery box was to challenge students to:

Work as a team, assign a leader, improvise, collaborate and focus on problem solving.

This method of cooking/activity promoted strategic thinking, including the ever-critical time factor. Their creativity, innovation, teamwork and time management was essential for this challenge.

Box # 1: Theme: One pot meal; you can only use ONE pot to prepare this meal (right).

Box # 2: Theme: No cooking dish; NO stove allowed (below).

Box # 3: Theme: Make your dessert in the form of different shapes and heights (bottom right corner).

Group # 1 was the winner while group # 2 and group # 3 had a tie for second place.

Jaedan Westerborg, a 12th grader, showed great leadership by carrying his group like a true leader.

Group # 2 took the initiative to make a drink using ingredients they had in their box.

Group #1 worked together and had great collaboration and determination.

After the challenge students went for a swim before coming back to school.

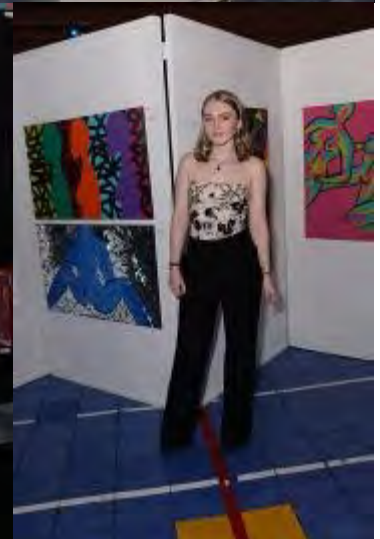
Miss Pandt and Miss Cristina were tremendous help. The students participated very well, they were well behaved and engaged. The field trip was a great success.
